## **A 30-year-old Samarth SoochnaPreneur from Dhamaura village, Bihar**

A widow and a young differently abled mother of two, Bandana, lives with her parents and brother while looking after herself and her children by providing services like printing, photocopying, laminating and other government schemes at her home with the help of SoochnaPreneur program. Valuing education and considering the public education provided in government schools to be of poor quality, she started looking for better opportunities so that she could provide better education to her children and was introduced to this program. From being a school teacher to a SoochnaPreneur, her income has doubled from 3,000 rupees to 6,000 rupees per month. Although her village struggles with stable supply of electricity and connectivity issues, she has set up a centre at her home with the help of a smartphone and printer that were provided to her. Using her savings, she bought a colour printer and a lamination machine through which she is growing her business.

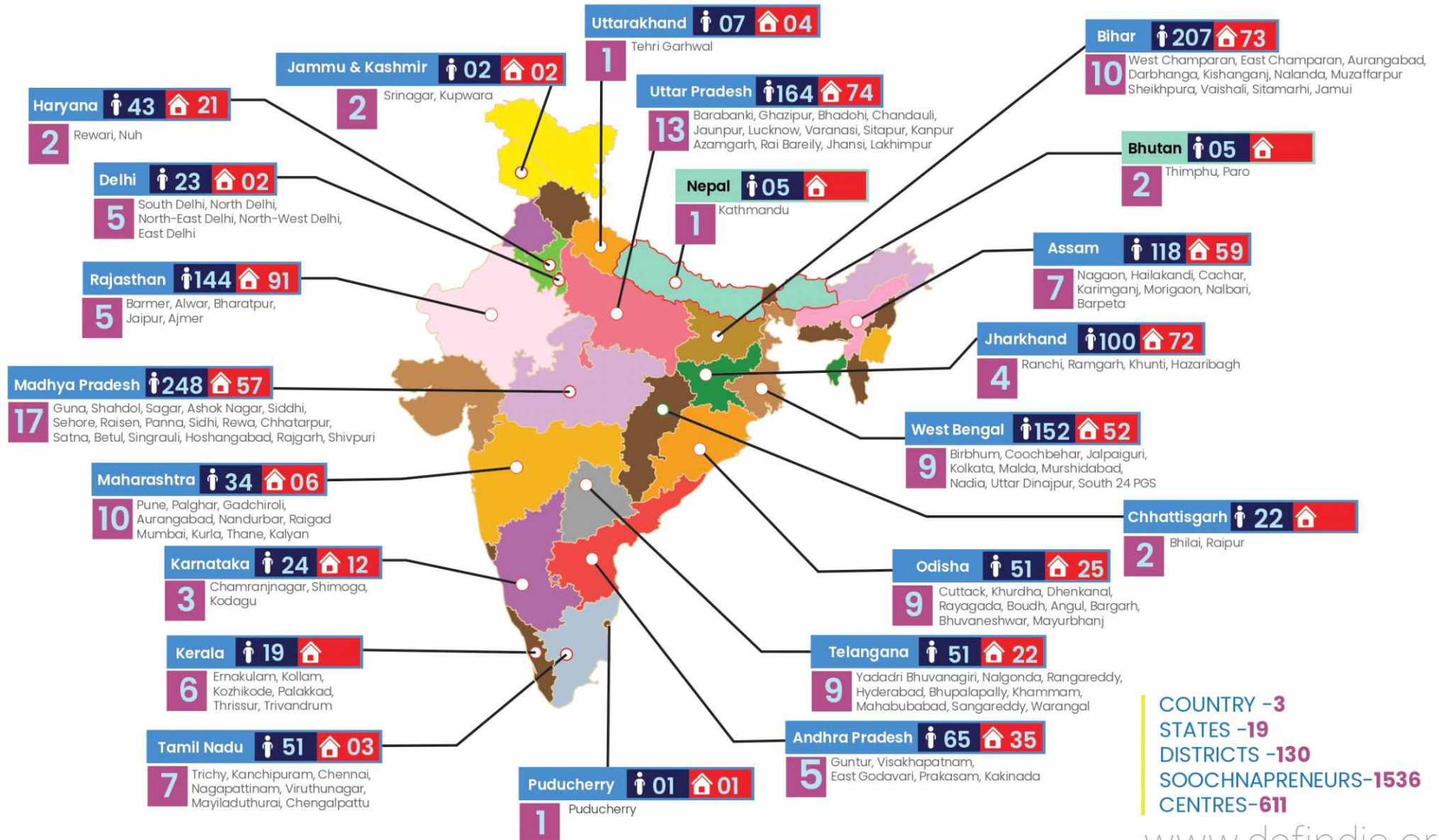
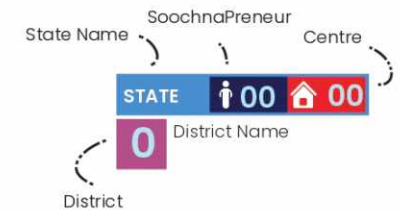
