













Introduction

Samarth SoochnaPreneur (SSP) is an initiative of the EquallyAble Foundation and the Digital Empowerment Foundation. The aim of the program is to digitally empower persons with disabilities to become social entrepreneurs and further empower their communities by providing them with digital access to governance, education and finance.

Each PwD is provided with digital training and digital tools such as tablets, laptops and printers and in turn (s)he uses the digital tools to provide digital services such as access to government schemes and services, Aadhar corrections, photocopies, online bookings, education, finance, health, livelihood, and several entitlements.

SSP allows the PwD to not only become independent and earn enough money to support their family but it also allows them to serve communities at large. One tablet, one printer and one laptop has the power to not only transform the life of a PwD but also of an entire community that has been in information darkness due to lack of access to digital tools.







Providing Access

Mala Khatun belongs to the district of Murshidabad, West Bengal. She belongs to a financially backward family and she has had low vision since her birth. Life for her has always come with obstacles attached to her disability. However, her undying spirit to overcome all her difficulties has made her a strong individual. She always wanted to financially support her family but was not aware of the ways from where she could support them. To her luck, she was introduced to the power of digital literacy and the benefits through a campaign organized by the Digital Empowerment Foundation.

Therefore, she enrolled herself in the digital literacy course offered by Digital Empowerment Foundation, where she learned about digital literacy. Currently, she is a Samarth Soochnapeneur who supports her community by rendering help in online banking, booking online railway and flight tickets, government entitlements etc. By doing so, she is not only earning a living for her family but also supporting her community.









Achieving Financial Freedom

Marijina Khatun hails from a small village in Murshidabad district, West Bengal. Even though she has always wanted to support her husband who is a daily wage worker, she could not find anything suitable due to her disability. During one of the program interventions by the Digital Empowerment Foundation in her community, she came into contact with one of the DEF coordinators, where she shared how her family is struggling to make ends meet.

The coordinator then enrolled her in DEF's digital literacy program, where she learned about various digital tools. After successful training, she became a Samarth Soochnaprenuer and now runs her own digital centre in her locality. Through her centre, she provides services like Internet banking, E-governance related services, printing and training on digital literacy to her community. Through her dedication and hard work, she is not only financially supporting her family but also developing her confidence to run a business on her own.









Digital Mentorship Creates a Digital Entrepreneur

Jyotsna Khatun is a 35-year-old Samarth Soochnaprenueur from Murshidabad district, West Bengal. She has a locomotor disability that restricts her movement. However, her family always supported her goal to be self-reliant, unlike her peers and community members who always demotivated her. Jyotsna is one of the GOAL mentees from the GOAL (Going Online As Leaders) Samarth program, an initiative of EquallyAble and Digital Empowerment Foundation. Through the program, she enrolled herself in the digital literacy program where she was trained to use digital tools and the internet to access information. Soon after that, she started her own digital centre with DEF's support, where she provides digital literacy to the community and also caters to their digital service needs like photocopy, enrollment in government schemes, etc. The centre has helped her in earning a steady income to support her family financially and at the same time it has also helped her in serving the community.









Age is Just a Number

Nurul Haque is 57 years old and currently living in cachar district, Assam. Since childhood, he has had a locomotor disability because of which he was not treated with dignity respected in his community. Even after multiple attempts, he was unable to support himself financially. However, one day his neighbour informed him about the digital center run by Digital Empowerment Foundation, where he enrolled himself as a student in the digital literacy classes. Nurul excelled in the classes, and became digitally literate and was able to further support himself. Later, he was given an opportunity to become a Samarth Soochanapenuer that helped him earn his livelihood by providing digital services to his community, such as online bill payments facilitation, providing printing services, printouts, introducing government schemes, etc. Now, Nurul is imparting digital literacy classes to the children of his community.

He was given digital equipments like a mobile phone, a desktop, a printer and a tablet and he is now using the equipment to serve others as well as earn an income for himself.

Emajuddin is now successfully operating the digital centre and training people on digital literacy, as well as providing various digital services to his community. He is delighted to become a part of such an initiative and is earning enough to provide for his family.
